## Professional MLA 2- & 3-Year Tracks

As designers and environmental stewards, Landscape Architects shape the way we experience the built and natural world. The University of Idaho 3-year MLA program is designed to build on a diversity of skills and knowledge gained by students with undergraduate degrees in a wide range of disciplines including: liberal arts, performing or fine arts, environmental science, natural resources, social sciences, ecology, engineering, business and economics. The MLA is a professional LAAB-accredited degree that prepares students for entry to the profession and licensure as a landscape architect.

The first year establishes a strong design and technical foundation with courses focusing on the health, safety and welfare components required for the landscape architecture licensing exam. The second and third years are dedicated to graduate-level design studios, seminars, research methods, and elective coursework. Students work on a thesis or master's project for their final year of the programs.

Students entering the MLA program with an accredited undergraduate degree in architecture, landscape architecture or a closely related field may be given up to **1 full year of advanced standing** upon review of their undergraduate transcripts.
