Online resources include federal, state and other websites provide easy access to data for topics such as education, housing, crime, agriculture, insurance, and children. Some websites provide indepth community profiles and tools to help you understand your economy.

Indicators Idaho

Managed by the UI's College of Agricultural & Life Sciences, Office of Grant and Project Development, this website provides up-to-date information on states, counties, selected communities, and reservations. Summaries and graphs highlight major trends for population characteristics, income and poverty, employment, housing, family and kids, health and crime. View ready-made maps, make your own maps, or download data.

Federal and State Data Sources

Census Bureau

- American Factfinder Population characteristics, income and poverty indicators, employment characteristics, education, housing characteristics, and more. Data are available for counties, places, reservations, census tracts and block groups, and can be displayed for individual racial and ethnic groups.
- <u>Population Estimates</u> Intercensal estimates (these are annual estimates in between decennial census years) for population characteristics and number of housing units for counties and places.
- State and County QuickFacts Quick profiles for counties.
- County and Zip Code Business Patterns Annual numbers of businesses by industry type and by number of employees.
- <u>Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates</u> Annual estimates of poverty rates and income levels for counties or school districts.
- <u>Small Area Health Insurance Estimates</u> Annual estimates of health insurance coverage for counties, starting with 2000 data.

Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA)

- Regional Economic Accounts, Local Area Personal Income Annual income and employment numbers like employment by industry, self-employment rate, wage per job, per capita income, and more.
- ♦ <u>BEA Bearfacts</u> Quick synopses of income and earnings data for counties.

 <u>Rural America at a Glance</u> - Profiles of Rural America include poverty, children, education, transportation, and the Hispanic population.
