The Self-Determined project option is designed for members to explore appropriate educational interests in subject areas where either: (1) no Idaho-approved 4-H curriculum exists, or (2) members have completed all levels of the approved curriculum and desire to continue learning about that subject in greater depth. At no time shall it be used to substitute for currently approved Idaho 4-H curriculum.

For safety and liability reasons all proposed Self-Determined project plans must be submitted to local Extension 4-H Professional for review and approval <u>before</u> members begin their project. The Extension 4-H Professional may require plan modifications and/or deny approval of the proposed plan if they foresee potential safety issues or if it does not comply with the parameters set forth above.

Because of inherent risk management issues, Self-Determined Projects related to the 4-H Shooting Sports program are not permitted under any circumstances.
