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## 4-H Oral Presentation Tips

Over the years I have noticed that 4-H members have a lot excitement about their projects, but a few things they are worried about and even fear. Public speaking is a huge skill that we work with 4-H youth on. However, public speaking ranks toward the top of many things people are most afraid of. With preparation and practice (lots of practice) we can help youth with this fear and be successful in giving presentations.

The first thing to remember is that there are options, lots of options. First, a youth should decide on a topic that they want to do an oral presentation on. I always recommend something that sparks a youth's curiosity, such as a question they want to know the answer to. Then decide if they want to do an illustrated talk, a demonstration, or a speech. The difference being is whether they present with posters and visual aids (illustrated talk), show how to do something (demonstration), or just use words to explain something (speech). Then they can start an outline with the information they have learned. The classic introduction, body, and conclusion can begin to take shape.

Practice. Practice and more practice. This can seem tedious, but if you know exactly what you are going to do, it will really help nerves.

If a youth is really scared of a group, start by having them give it to a very small number of people such as one caregiver and their leader. Build up to gradually larger and larger groups over time. For some youth this can happen in a year and for others, it make take years to become comfortable. Try to judge what is most comfortable for each youth.

Once a youth feels good about their presentation skills, recommend that they enter a county contest. We host two each year: 4-H Horse Oral Presentation and County 4-H Oral Presentations. These are qualifiers for larger contests and a great challenge!

Remember that each youth develops at their own pace. Try to help them at the level of learning they are at today. Challenge each to do their best and applaud them for all of their efforts. All skill building is a journey, including public speaking.

Declaration due dates are scheduled by species and listed below. Declarations are not required for breeding animals and small animals.

Prior to tags being available participants will need to be enrolled in the correct market project in Zsuite. **Members will need to reserve tags by midnight the night before at [canyoncountyfair.org](http://canyoncountyfair.org).** Tags should be placed in the animals left ear (when you stand over the animal)

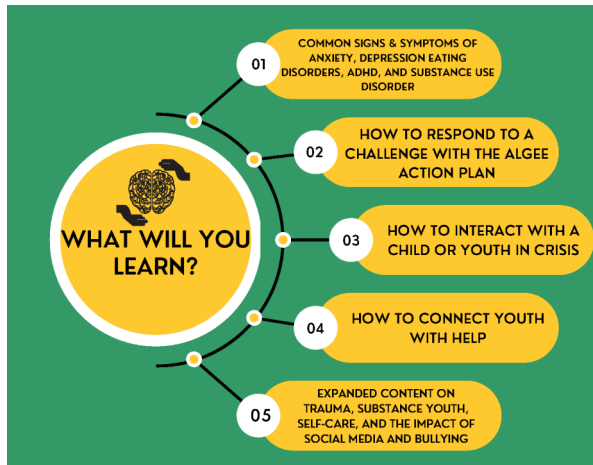

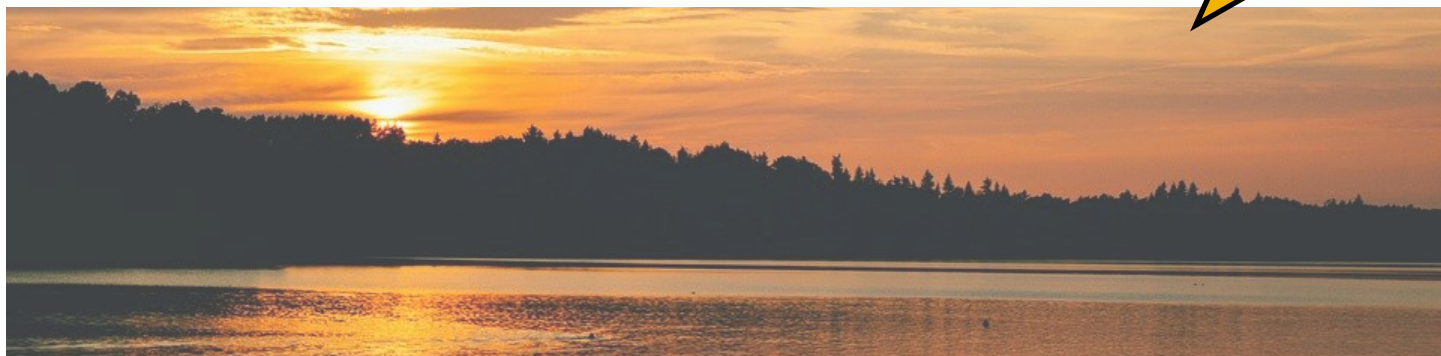

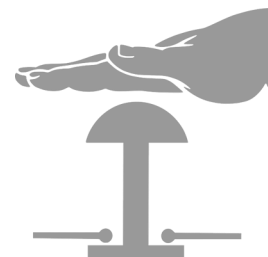
