Erling Johannesen graduated from the University of Idaho College of Agriculture and Life Science. He began his career as the Gem County Extension Agent in 1944. For 37 years he inspired 4-H youth to aspire to higher levels of leadership within their club, community and country. Erling and Amy Johannesen Scholarship was created in 2008, with income going to Idaho 4-H programs, administered by the U of I College of Agriculture. Erling also served for many years on the board of the U of I Foundation. He was the first in Idaho history to be named for service on a four-man Board of Directors of National Association of County Agricultural Agents.
