Monster Muffins

The spinach in these muffins is not enough to give the muffins a vegetable flavor, but it does impart a little extra nutrition and a brilliant green color. They are lightly sweet and cinnamon-y, and your kids will love them.

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray a muffin pan with cooking spray or line with muffin cups. You'll need 18.
- 2. In a large bowl, whisk together flour, cinnamon, baking powder, baking soda, and salt.
- 3. In a blender or food processor, puree all remaining ingredients.
- 4. Fold puree into the dry ingredients until just combined.
- 5. Divide the batter evenly into the muffin cups, and bake until firm to the touch (18-22 minutes).

Ingredient lists

- 2 cups whole-wheat flour
- 1½ tsp. cinnamon
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- ½ tsp. baking soda
- ½ tsp. salt
- ¾ cup skim milk
- ½ cup unsweetened applesauce



Lego Spike Essentials

On April 6th and 7th students in 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th grades at the Driggs and Victor locations will be participating in a 4 week adventure into the world of science, technology, engineering and math. Students will learn to describe a program's sequence of events, goals, and expected outcomes. They will practice helping story characters and participate in collaborative conversations. Students will develop programs to solve issues, learn the art of note taking and work together in teams. They will learn about programs that use simple loops (repetition). Using skills in collaboration and teamwork they will work together to test and debug programs they create. Lego Education Spike essentials kits are helping students identify problems, engineer and build solutions to help with real world problems that they and their friends may experience.

Exploring the world of STEM "is really cool", said Kent Johnson a member of the 4-H S.T.E.A.M. club that meets on Fridays at the University of Idaho Extension Office. S.T.E.A.M. Club members Brian Moreno and Kyler Werlin are using their experiences with Lego Spike Essentials and are assisting with the Driggs ABC students lessons. Brian will be communicating instruction, demonstrating what he has learned and helping ABC students master building and programming. Kyler will be helping set up the classroom weekly for the Driggs students and assisting with the weekly agenda.




